As part of a pedagogical exercise in teaching and encouraging "Accountable Talk / Des Discussions Responsables", students were asked to come up with ideas on how we could best honour the custodial staff. Students had to listen attentively to each other's ideas, and respond using verbal and non-verbal ways which demonstrated courtesy and respect. An

effort was made to model how to take each idea offered seriously and elevate the most humble suggestion to a winning preposition! As a teacher, Mme Zarecki learned how empowering students and giving them a voice, is a win-win approach. They came up with authentic and adorable ideas. Parents were very supportive of the process and felt engaged as well. FROM THE OCDSB'S SCHOOL COUNCIL NEWSLETTER...

New: French Instruction in Kindergarten and Primary Early French Immersion

This week the Board made a final decision on the delivery of French instruction in Kindergarten. Beginning September 2016, all kindergarten programs will be 50% English and 50% French. The entry point for Early French Immersion will move to grade 1. All students in grades 1 through 3, enrolled in Early French Immersion, will have math instruction in English beginning in September 2016.

In the coming months, staff will be working on detailed implementation plans to support the new delivery model. This includes plans to allocate resources to provide additional supports in the kindergarten program to assist students with special needs as well as the English language learners.

Parents of students enrolled in kindergarten for the fall for 2016 can anticipate more information will be provided to them before the end of the current school year. In addition, updates will be posted to the district website.

The school district would like to thank all the parents, staff and community members who took the time to participate in the consultation and decision-making process on this topic.

Math Facts

Communicating with Children Using Math Language

Talking about mathematics with your child - whatever his or her age - helps strengthen his or her mathematical reasoning and understanding. Some ways to keep the talk engaged and focused while you support your child include:

- 1. Revoice Repeat what you heard your child say, then ask for clarification (e.g., "So you are saying it's an odd number?").
- 2. Repeat/Restate Ask your child to restate your reasoning (e.g., "Can you repeat what I said in your own words?").
- 3. Reason Ask your child to apply his or her own reasoning to someone else's reasoning (e.g., "Do you agree or disagree? Tell me why.").
- 4. Adding On Prompt your child to participate further (e.g., "What more would you add to that?").
- 5. Think Time Wait several seconds (try five) to give your child time to think (e.g., "Take some time to think."). You may be surprised by how hard it is to stay silent in that time!
