Math Facts (From the School Council Newsletter)

Wrong Answers, Great Learning Thomas Edison said that he did not fail at making the light bulb one thousand times, but rather that "the light bulb was an invention with 1,000 steps."

"I've missed more than 9,000 shots in my career. I've lost almost 300 games. 26 times I've been trusted to take the game winning shot... and missed. I've failed over and over and over again in my life. That is why I succeed." (Michael Jordan)

Making mistakes is a natural part of all learning. Those who we consider to be "great" are clear that mistakes lead to learning. The latest research on mathematics shows that mistakes are a very important part of learning math! When a person makes an error in math and they have the opportunity to learn from it, they actually develop a much stronger understanding. In fact, the research states that students learn more from making mistakes than from getting all the right answers.

When your child makes an error, it offers insight into what understanding your child has about a mathematical idea. It allows parents and teachers to talk to the child about what they know, and ask questions to stretch their thinking around where they are currently developing their understanding.

Parents can ask "How do you know that? What was your thinking here? Is there another way you could solve that? How did you think about X (an element they may be missing or have misunderstood)?" This conversation helps to develop the crucial skills of reasoning and communication and is therefore more helpful than simply showing a child how the math is done. When you support an attitude that values learning from mistakes, you are telling your child that mistakes are a valuable and natural ingredient in learning and lead to deeper understanding

JUNIOR AND SENIOR KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Registration for Junior and Senior Kindergarten for 2016-2017 school year will take place from **Monday**, **January 25th**, **2016 to Friday**, **January 29th**, **2016.** Children who will be four years old by December 31st, 2016 will be eligible for Junior Kindergarten. Children who will be five years by December 31st, 2016 will be eligible for Senior Kindergarten. To register your child for full day kindergarten, please come into the school office between the hours of 9:00a.m. and 3:00p.m. Your child's immunization record, proof of address and age (birth certificate) and health card are necessary to complete the registration process. Please pass this information along to your friends and neighbours especially if they are not already Knoxdale families, or encourage them to contact us if they have any questions. We will be hosting two information sessions for new Kindergarten parents. The first session will be a general information session about Kindergarten and the OCDSB and will be held on <u>Thursday</u>, January 21st, 2016 from 6:30pm to 7:30pm. A further session will be held for parents of students who have registered and will be more specific to Knoxdale and our Kindergarten Program and will be held on <u>Thursday</u>, January 21st, May 12th, 2016 from 6:30pm to 7:30pm, both will be held in the Knoxdale Library.

MIDDLE FRENCH IMMERSION REGISTRATION

Registration for Grade 4 Middle French Immersion will take place from **Tuesday, February 16th, 2016 to Monday, February 22nd, 2016.** An information night will be held on <u>Thursday, February 4th,</u> <u>2016 from 6:30pm to 7:30pm</u> in the Knoxdale Library. ELEMENTARY STUDENT TRANSFER PROCESS

If parents/guardians would like their child to be considered to attend a school other than his or her designated school for the following school year, they must complete a transfer form and return it to the school you would like your child to attend **Monday, February 8th to Friday, February 19th, 2016**. Students who are not attending their designated school are not entitled to transportation. Students must still register at their designated school pending approval of the transfer request. Transfer forms are available in all schools. This information can also be found on the Board's website: <u>www.ocdsb.ca</u>.

NEW PA DAY

The following is to update you regarding the addition of a Professional Activity (PA) day to the required number of PA days that must be designated by each school board. A key term of the provincial settlements recently negotiated by the elementary and secondary teacher federations is the provision of an additional PA day to the school year, effective the 2015-2016 school year.

As such, the following PA days at elementary and secondary levels will be in place for both elementary and secondary schools. There will be no classes for students on these dates. In addition, at the secondary level, there is a resulting amendment to the examination dates for semesters 1 and 2.

Focus of the P.A. Days: As identified by the Ministry of Education, elementary educators will be focusing half the day on mathematics education and half the day on health and safety. Secondary educators will be focusing on Ministry priorities, including mathematics education and/or equity. Supports will be provided centrally. More details to follow.
