

Math Facts (From the School Council Newsletter) Wrong Answers, Great Learning

Thomas Edison said that he did not fail at making the light bulb one thousand times, but rather that "the light bulb was an invention with 1,000 steps."

"I've missed more than 9,000 shots in my career. I've lost almost 300 games. 26 times I've been trusted to take the game winning shot... and missed. I've failed over and over and over again in my life. That is why I succeed." (Michael Jordan)

Making mistakes is a natural part of all learning. Those who we consider to be "great" are clear that mistakes lead to learning. The latest research on mathematics shows that mistakes are a very important part of learning math! When a person makes an error in math and they have the

opportunity to learn from it, they actually develop a much stronger understanding. In fact, the research states that students learn more from making mistakes than from getting all the right answers.



When your child makes an error, it offers insight into what understanding your child has about a mathematical idea. It allows parents and teachers to talk to the child about what they know, and ask questions to stretch their thinking around where they are currently developing their understanding.

Parents can ask: "How do you know that? What was your thinking here? Is there another way you could solve that? How did you think about X (an element they may be missing or have misunderstood)?". This conversation helps to develop the crucial skills of reasoning and communication and is therefore more helpful than simply showing a child how the math is done. When you support an attitude that values learning from mistakes, you are telling your child that mistakes are a valuable and natural ingredient in learning and lead to deeper understanding.

GROWTH MINDSET

At Knoxdale, we are continuously working on our growth mindset. Growth mindset is embedded in both our School Learning Plan and our School Plan for Student Well-Being. In Mme Zarecki's and Mme Ketchum's classes, students were invited to take a challenge and create trees using a different method from which they are accustomed. Instead of using a pencil to draw a silhouette of a tree, they used scissors to take away the negative space created by the tree. This activity required a shift in mindset for some of our learners, however, look at the wonderful creations that resulted! Each one has its own style, personality and evokes a different sentiment.

KINDERGARTEN REGISTRATION

Registration for Kindergarten for 2017-2018 school year will take place from Monday, January 23rd, 2017 to Friday, January 27th, 2017. Children who will be four years old by December 31st, 2017 will be eligible for Year 1 Kindergarten. Children who will be five years by December 31st, 2017 will be eligible for Year 2 Kindergarten. To register your child for full day kindergarten, please come into the school office between the hours of 9:00a.m. and 3:00p.m. Your proof of address and you child's age (birth certificate) and health card are necessary to complete the registration process. Please pass this information along to your friends and neighbours especially if they are not already Knoxdale families, or encourage them to contact us if they have any questions. We are hosting two information sessions for new Kindergarten parents. The first session was a general information session about Kindergarten and the OCDSB. This session was held yesterday evening. A further session will be held for parents of students who have registered and will be more specific to Knoxdale and our Kindergarten Program and will be held on <u>Thursday, May 11th</u>, <u>2017 from 6:30pm to 7:30pm</u>, both will be held in the Knoxdale Library. Children who currently attend Knoxdale PS do not need to register for year 2 Kindergarten.

MIDDLE FRENCH IMMERSION REGISTRATION

Registration for Grade 4 Middle French Immersion will take place from Monday, February 13th, 2017 to Friday, February 17th, 2017. An information night will be held on <u>Thursday, February</u> 9th, 2017 from 6:00pm to 7:00pm in the Knoxdale Library. ELEMENTARY STUDENT TRANSFER PROCESS

If parents/guardians would like their child to be considered to attend a school other than his or her designated school for the following school year, they must complete a transfer form and return it to the school you would like your child to attend **Monday**, **February 6th to Friday**, **February 17th**, **2017**. Students who are not attending their designated school are not entitled to transportation. Students must still register at their designated school pending approval of the transfer request. OTTAWA PUBLIC HEALTH (OPH) IMMUNIZATION

As a parent, keeping your kids safe and healthy is your number one priority. All children attending school between ages 4 to 17 need to be immunized according to Ontario Immunization Schedule. Immunization protects children from many serious diseases that are easily spread in schools. Parents are required to report all immunizations done at the doctor's office to OPH. Under this *Act*, OPH has the authority to suspend students from school. Due to the size of our District, OPH is dividing its surveillance campaign into two phases. The first phase of notification letters to parents alerting them of missing documentation was sent out on November 15, 2016 and the second on November 22, 2016. Suspensions for the first group will commence on February 8, 2017 and for the second group on February 22, 2017 so it is very important to ensure your child's immunizations are up to date. <u>http://www.parentinginottawa.com/en/immunization.asp</u>
