CURRICULUM CORNER

For those whose reference for school is their own education, what a classroom looks like, sounds like, and feels like is quite different than many years ago! There has been a great shift from rote learning and direct instruction to asking students to analyze, evaluate, share their thinking and to reflect on what they are learning. In this environment, the teacher is also a co-learner and a facilitator of information sharing and uncovering. Our



students' ability to access information is very different than learners 15 years ago. When we were at school, we would often use encyclopedias and many visits to the library to do research for a project. Our students now have all that information at their fingertips! With this change also comes a shift in how students are learning. One of the greatest gifts we can give our students is the ability to critically evaluate the information they receive (i.e, determining reliability etc). In our

classrooms you will often find students sharing their thinking; with a peer, in a small group or with the larger group.

The goals of such discourse are to build knowledge together and to listen to and learn from different points of view and perspectives. We also nurture creativity in students and encourage a sense of wonder (i.e., What are you wondering about...? What are you noticing?). The Wonder Wall in the picture above is a perfect example of capturing students' wonderings. Another important aspect to our teaching practices is personalization; taking into account students' interests to create learning opportunities that capitalize on their strengths and interests, as well as, allowing for flexibility in their learning.?". We continually strive to raise the bar for our students by creating authentic, engaging and meaningful learning experiences.

BUSING INFORMATION- FROM OSTA

2017-18 Student Transportation Information:

Route information will be available to parents as of August 20, 2017 via the online Parent Web Portal. Student Transportation Information can also be found using the "Stop Finder" located on the main page of our website, which will link to the "BusPlanner - Parent Portal". You must enter the student's last name, birthdate, school and grade in order to access route and stop information. The "Stop Finder" feature returns bus stop and route information for eligible students who are assigned to regular yellow school bus or small school purpose vehicle service, or for eligible grade 7 and 8 students who are assigned to OC Transpo Service. OC Transpo route schedules will also be made available through the OSTA website or can be found directly through the OC Transpo website at www.octranspo.com. More information on routes to specific schools can be obtained on OC Transpo's Quick Planner under High Schools and Middle Schools.

Small School Purpose Vehicles

The driver responsible for the route will contact each family directly prior to the first day of school.

Students with Special Needs - Requests for Accessible Transportation

Each student requiring special accommodation for transportation should have a "Request for Accessible Transportation" form completed by their parents, signed by the Principal and forwarded to the Spec Ed department. The Spec Ed department will then send the form to OSTA with any appropriate comments that would help us meet the student's individual needs.

Transportation for students in a joint custody arrangement with two homes

OSTA has developed a new policy & procedure to deliver transportation services to students in a joint custody arrangement and having two homes. An application process and other requirements need to be met for parents to receive this service, and the homes or daycares in question must meet all other eligibility requirements. The deadline for new applications or changes to existing applications for September start up transportation was June 1. Renewals of current schedule calendars (no other changes) are due June 30. All other applications will be reviewed after September 15, and prior to October 1. Kindergarten Staggered Entry and ID

School bus routes are planned according to the number of registered students in the data system from May to July 2017. We continue to make changes in transportation throughout school start up. Routes are driven as planned as of the first day of school September 2017 and drivers will stop at each stop, regardless of whether Kinder students are beginning that day or whether they are beginning later on in the week. A reminder that parents of Kinder students MUST make

arrangements to have the SAME person meet their child at their stop every afternoon. Parents may identify one alternate person only.
