
UPDATES FROM KNOXDALE PS AND KCSC

CURRICULUM CORNER


At Knoxdale PS, we are always looking at how to support and further student learning using high yield instructional strategies. The picture below is taken in a kinder class where students recorded their "wonderings". This strategy encourages students to think, reflect and also allows for personalization in their learning. This strategy can be extended to use across the grades as well. For example, in Math while looking at a set of numbers or even at a word problem, students can be asked "What do you notice" and "What are you wondering?". These questions do not have one right or wrong answer, and therefore, allow students to take risks in their responses. When students share what they "notice" and "wonder" they build their understanding collaboratively and can often approach the problem from different perspectives.



At Knoxdale, we believe in collaboration in all aspects of school. Collaboration can be powerful across the curriculum, however, particularly in




Math. When students work



collaboratively to solve problems in Math, they benefit from hearing different approaches and strategies to solve problems. In the photo to the left, the chart paper posted represents each group's work to solve one problem. Although difficult to see from the picture, each group looked at multiple strategies to solve the problem. The picture above highlights the importance of not only being able to manipulate numbers to solve a problem but also the importance of being able to explain your thinking on how the problem was solved. This is evidenced in the picture above where the students are explaining (in writing) the steps that they went through to solve the problem.

OUR COMMUNITY OF CHARACTER

In our last update, we shared that the primary students have been learning how to be "bucket fillers" which was launched at our September assembly. The September assembly for our junior students was slightly different. The junior assembly had the students using the mentor text <u>,The Important Book</u>, to spark a discussion about what is important in different areas of our life (i.e., at school, for yourself, for your family etc.). Students then worked collaboratively to brainstorm things that are important at school (i.e., What is important for learning?, What is important for collaboration?, What is important at Knoxdale? etc.). We have now posted these boards around the school for them to become interactive. We welcome you to record your thoughts on the boards and students and staff will be adding to them as well starting next week.

Important Information Regarding Child Care for November 20th

Please see the message below from the OCDSB. Parents who have children in the EDP program have received this message via email directly.

Please be advised that the Extended Day Program operated by the Ottawa-Carleton District School Board will be cancelled on Friday, November 20th, 2015. Please be advised that the OCDSB extended day program will not be able to offer full day child care on November 20th, a scheduled professional activity day. The continuing sanctions by OSSTF support staff have made it extremely difficult to ensure an accurate registration process and this creates a serious impact on our safe arrival process. We understand the difficulties this will cause for parents, but cannot proceed when we are unable to assure the safety of all of our students. The cancellation applies to all EDP programs operated directly by the OCDSB. Those sites which are managed by a third party operator will continue to operate.

PARKING LOT SAFETY

Unfortunately, we are noticing an increase in poor driving habits by some in our parking lot, which is a safety concern for our students and staff. While the vast majority of drivers using our parking lot are courteous, patient and understanding of the need for care, a few are driving too fast, not following instructions from staff, or exiting the lot through the entrance.
