# UPDATES FROM KNOXDALE PS AND KCSC

#### CURRICULUM CORNER

On October 7th our school team participated in a PA Day. We always appreciate time to learn Together! Our focus was on our School Learning Plan. This year, all schools in our district will have a School Learning Plan that focuses on numeracy. We have taken a great deal of time to look carefully at multiple sources of data in order to inform our thinking and next steps. This included EQAO data, report card data, and classroom data including observational data. As a staff we had the opportunity to ask ourselves some powerful questions in conjunction with a review of teaching practices and delivery of program.

One piece of evidence that we noted from our data was that our students struggled in the face of multi-step problems and/or difficult problems. In fact, there was a marked percentage of students who left answers blank and did not attempt (as compared with the board and province). As such, in conjunction with having a theory of action for our School Learning Plan that focuses on numeracy across the curriculum, we have also identified a need to work on Growth Mindset. This is tied to our theory of action, as well as, to our Student Well-Being Plan.

The achievement chart below outlines four areas of academic assessment; Communication,

NB. This achievement chart represents the assessment direction as mandated by the Ministry of Education and OCDSB

Knowledge and Understanding, Application and Thinking. This achievement chart is applicable to all subject areas and is included as part of curricular documents. We also considered our data in light of the achievement chart to see where were our students' strengths and areas for growth. We

noted that our students needed to strengthen their skills in Thinking and Communication. To this end, we identified the following strategies:

- 1) Self-verbalization
- 2) Number talks
- 3) Accountable talk (which formed part of our previous SLP)
- 4) Math journals/thought journals (thought journals were also part of our previous SLP)
- \* Stay tuned to our next update for more information on each of these strategies!

Our School Learning Plan has a theory of action as follows:

If students have regular opportunities to develop their self-verbalization skills in numeracy across the curriculum, then they will increase their capacity (in thinking and communication) and develop confidence in their numeracy skills (growth mindset).

In our School Well Being Plan, one of our goals is focused on mindset. It is as follows:

If we explicitly teach/model for students growth mindset strategies/language, then students will

be more confident in their abilities when faced with challenging tasks.

# Growth Mindset

"Growth Mindset" est une échelle qui commence à « Je n'y arriverai pas » jusqu'à la fin ou il est écrit « Oui! Je l'ai fait! ». Après « Je n'y arriverai pas » ça dit, « Je ne peux pas le faire ». Puis, ça dit, « Je veux le faire ». Tu dois te poser une question importante après ceci: « Comment puis-je le faire? ». Quand tu as trouvé une réponse, tu vas probablement te dire, « Je peux le faire! ». Ensuite, nous montons à « Je vais le faire ». Finalement, à la fin de l'échelle, nous célébrons parce que: « Oui! Je l'ai fait! « . Les enfants dans la classe de Mme. Desjardins ont fait des petits dessins pour chaque

étape. Que faisons-nous avec cette échelle? Cette échelle nous aide à penser à la question suivante:
« Quelle étape avez-vous atteint aujourd'hui? ». Si tu te dis: « Je n'y arriverai pas », tu n'arriveras pas à réussir parce que tu n'es pas convaincu de tes habiletés et tu ne crois pas dans toi-même. Mais si tu te dis, « Je veux le faire « , ceci est meilleur parce que tu commences à croire dans tes habiletés et tu réussis à développer une pensée positive! Un exemple de "Growth Mindset" est si tu dis « Je ne suis pas



bonne dans les maths! », mais au lieu tu devrais dire: « Je vais pratiquer les mathématiques! Je suis capable! ». Vous pouvez aussi dire, « Je ne suis pas bon aux mathématiques ENCORE ».! <u>Encore</u>étant le mot clé icil

Growth mindset is going from "I'm never going to do it" to "I did it!". Above you will find the Growth Mindset stages we use in Mme Desjardins' class.

You can see it is a scale that starts with "I am never going to do it", to "I can't do it", to "I want to do it", to "How can I do it?", to "I am going to try to do it ", to "I can do it!", to "I am going to do it!" and finally, "Yay, I did it!!!". In class you can use the scale when you have hard work and you think "I can't do it". You look up at the chart, find your next step and say "How could I do it?" or "I am going to try to do it".

So that is the chart but what is growth mindset? It's saying "I can do it!", instead of saying "I can't do it", when something is difficult. You use growth mindset sometimes when you get evaluated. For example, you get a test back and you see you got a C+. Instead of thinking, "Oh that is a horrible mark", you can change your words and say, "I'll get a better mark next time". When you have a fixed mindset and you receive a poor mark on a test you may say things like; "I am bad" and "I can't do

math -it's impossible-I am never getting better". So, as you can see, if you change words you can change your mindset!



# ELEMENTARY SCHOOL PROGRAM FRAMEWORK CONSULTATION

The district has just released a draft Elementary School Program Framework (ESPF). The Framework explains that the district's model for elementary school program delivery is the designated community school model. The framework outlines our elementary program offerings, school configuration models, school size, and addresses single and dual track schools.

It is a companion document to the Secondary School Program Framework. Together these two documents describe our vision for school configuration models and program offerings from K-12. These two frameworks will inform decision making in accommodation planning in terms of how best to use District facilities and resources to offer exemplary programming in a fiscally responsible manner.

Consultation on the ESPF is undeway and we are interested in your feedback. There are a number of ways to get involved:

- Discuss this issue at school council;
- complete the survey; and/or
- Send an e-mail.

Consultation is planned between November 3 to December 21st. The survey deadline is December 13, 2016. The final staff report, including feedback gathered through consultation will be presented for discussion at the OCDSB Committee of the Whole meeting on January 17, 2017.
