
UPDATES FROM KNOXDALE PS AND KCSC

CURRICULUM CORNER

For those whose reference for school is their own education, what a classroom looks like, sounds like, and feels like is quite different than many years ago! There has been a great shift from rote learning and direct instruction to asking students to analyze, evaluate, share their thinking and to reflect on what they are learning. In this environment, the teacher is also a co-learner and a facilitator of information sharing and uncovering. Our students' ability to access information is very different than learners 15 years ago. When we were at school, we would often use encyclopedias and many visits to the library to do research for a project. Our students now have all that information at their fingertips! With this change also comes a shift in how students are learning. One of the greatest gifts we can give our students is the ability to critically evaluate the information they receive (i.e, determining reliability etc). In our classrooms you will often find







The goals of such discourse are to build knowledge together and to listen to and learn from different points of view and perspectives. We also nurture creativity in students and encourage a sense of wonder (i.e., What are you wondering about...? What are you noticing?). The Wonder Wall

in the picture above is a perfect example of capturing students' wonderings. Another important aspect to our teaching practices is personalization; taking into account students' interests to create learning opportunities that capitalize on their strengths and interests, as well as, allowing for flexibility in their learning. This is evidenced in the picture on the right wherein students were asked the question "What do you want to learn this year?". We continually strive to raise the bar for our students by creating authentic, engaging and meaningful learning experiences.

MONARCH BUTTERFLIES

Three classes are participating in a project with Monarch Without Frontiers. One has already had a

monarch butterfly hatch from the chrysalis, and was released into our butterfly garden in the nature center. Two classes have had all their caterpillars turn into chrysalis, and now students are just waiting the 7 to 18 days until the monarch butterflies will hatch. - Mme Muller

Dear parents,

We are here to talk to you about Monarch butterflies, these are not just ordinary butterflies they are nature's best friend. Sadly these butterflies are in danger and we need your help to keep these wonderful butterflies alive.



In Mme. Muller's class there were real life butterflies. Here are some of the things we learned. They start off as a very small egg, and then comes out a small yellow, black and white caterpillar. Now we have a caterpillar! It can only eat milkweed -it tastes gross! After eating a lot of milkweed they get into a "j" formation then it sheds it's skin four times and becomes the chrysalis. The

warmer the temperature, the faster it will hatch. When it hatches it has to dry off its wings and after a while it can fly but if it hits its wing on something it will have trouble flying. This is why they are in danger in Mexico. They are cutting down trees and now the butterflies have trouble finding a habitat to lay their eggs and if they can't lay their eggs then there will not be as many monarchs. These amazing butterflies fly to Mexico and it takes them one generation to get there and it takes them three

generations to get back. It is amazing how much courage these little butterflies have to fly all the way to Mexico. Us humans use a plane or a car depending where you live and if you are lucky you may see a monarch butterfly. It was a really fun experience teaching you all about monarchs!!! HALLOWEEN CRAFT CLUB



BUS SAFETY AND EVACUATION DRILLS

On Monday October 24th, bus riders will participate in OSTA's bus safety and evacuation program. The evacuation practice requires a certain amount of physical exertion and participants might be prone to injury due to a pre-existing condition. The drill is an opportunity to ensure that the driver and students understand what accommodations will be required to safely evacuate a bus in an emergency. Similar to a fire drill, the support of your child's safety during the drill exercise needs to be paramount. We will need to identify those students who require special consideration and determine how best to support them during the drill. If there are concerns please contact Mr. Powers at the school. Student can complete only the in-class portion of the safety exercise.

COOLER WEATHER

The temperatures are dropping and the days are often a little wetter. It's time to bring out our warm and snuggly clothes. Students are outside during the day and when dressed for the weather are much happier.

LOST AND FOUND

We have many items in our Lost and Found! We have been encouraging students to check it for missing items. At the end of every month, we will be donating unclaimed items to a local charity. If you have not yet checked the lost and found, please do so before next Friday.
